Head Start/Early Head Start

267 children ages 0-5 received free, high quality childcare and early childhood education at one of our centers across the Midcoast region.

Program Highlight: New classrooms across the Midcoast region

MMCA expanded Early Head Start services with new classrooms in Brunswick, Salt Bay, and Waldoboro, along with transportation support for Waldoboro families accessing Salt Bay. Our partnership with Bath Tech allows local high school students studying Early Childhood Education to work alongside our Head Start staff to engage young learners.



WIC (Women, Infants, Children) Program

2,191 pregnant and post-partum parents and children ages up to age 5 were provided nutritional education, supplemental food vouchers, and healthcare referrals.

Program Highlight: Waldo Hospital Partnership

Thanks to donated office space from MaineHealth Waldo Hospital, MMCA's WIC program offers services to participants in a more accessible, supportive environment, reinforcing our shared commitment to community health and well-being.



LiHEAP (Low-income Home Energy Assistance Program)

1,468 Mainers stayed warm in their homes by receiving financial aid for their home heating costs.



Whole Families Coaching

15 individuals were provided comprehensive, trauma-informed, whole family coaching and case management.



Families CAN! Program

223 community members attended evidence-based, award-winning enrichment programs for parents, caregivers, and professionals.

Program Highlight: Community Baby Shower

Our 2nd annual Community Baby Shower welcomed over 100 caregivers to collect resources from community partners in early childhood education, parent supports, nutrition, and more. The event also featured a free "baby boutique", fabulous raffle prizes, and tours of our Bath Head Start center.



In 2024, Families CAN! was recognized at the City of Bath's Community Involvement Day, receiving the Community Project Award.





Economic Stability


